

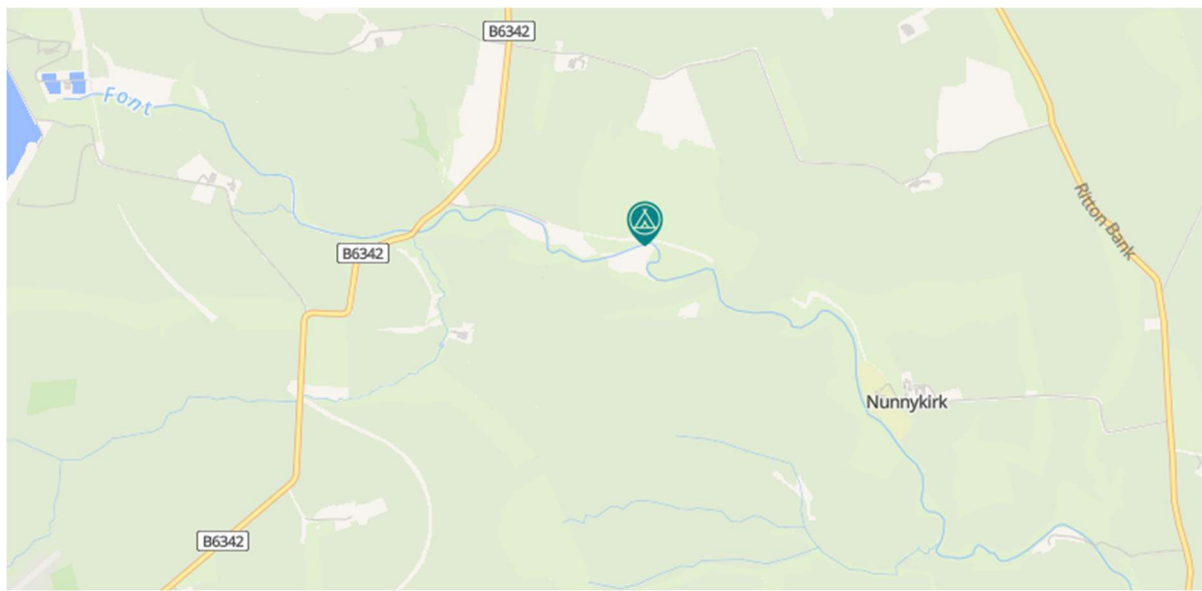


Nunnykirk Scout Campsite Visitor Information

About the site

Nunnykirk Scout camp site comprises of **three fields**, separated by a river and woodland – an ideal setting for Scouts, Guides, school and youth groups.

Camping is available year-round subject to weather conditions. We reserve the right to cancel bookings if conditions are unsuitable.

Booking Information

- Nunnykirk campsite consists of 3 fields. Currently Fields 2 and 3 are available for bookings.
- Field 2 is the central field on shown on the map. Field 3 is furthest from the entrance.
- To book please use the OSM booking system. You can find a link to the booking system via www.northumberlandscouts.org.uk/nunnykirk/
- For booking purposes, you will be asked to book a pitch/pitches based on the number of campers you will have.
- Pitches are as follows:
 - Field 2, pitches 1 - 5
 - Field 3, pitches 6 - 10
- To book, select your preferred field - either field 2 or field 3 - and the number of pitches you require.
- **1 pitch = up to 20 campers.** You should book additional pitches in
- multiples of 20 as needed.
- If you have booked multiple pitches on one Field, we will ensure your pitches are located next to each other, regardless of whether the pitch numbers are consecutive.

Arrival and departure times

- **Arrival:** From 15:00 on your first day. Please let us know your estimated arrival time as soon as you are able. Tents may be pitched prior to arrival with agreement from the site.
- **Departure:** By 16:00 on your final day. We allow a grace period of 2 days after your departure to remove your tents, to be used in cases where your tents need to be dried out, or the weather is poor and you need to take your young people home before packing away. You may be charged for any fields/pitches still occupied after this 2-day period if you are taking space away from other campers.

Fees (2026) - *Subject to review in 2026*

- **Scouting Groups:** £4.50 per person per night.
- **Non-Scouting Groups:** £5.00 per person per night.
- **Day visitors:** Scouts £1.00 per day. Non-Scouts £2.00 per day.
- **Electric Hook-Up:** £10 per night, per cable from the post.
- **Exclusive Campsite Hire (field 2 or 3, or both):** Contact us to discuss availability and price.
- **Marquee hire available:** Contact us to discuss availability and price
- **There is a deposit fee of 10% per head,** to be paid in advance of your visit. Failure to pay may result in the cancellation of your booking.

Vehicles and access

- Access is via a **private road** - please drive respectfully and keep speeds below 5 mph. Be aware of pedestrians and wildlife along the road.
- Groups must manage traffic on the **single-track road**. Use the **car park opposite the main building** unless unloading gear.
- **No vehicles** are allowed on the camping fields. Use gravel roads only. Any damage will incur a **minimum £100 repair fee**.
- Please close the gate at night, but do not lock in case emergency access is necessary.
- **The code for lock on the site gate will be emailed to you 1 week prior to the date of your booking.** We suggest that this gate is left closed, but not locked, for the duration of your stay. **Please remember to lock this gate when you leave.**

Site guidelines

- Leave pitches **clean and tidy, sites will be inspected after you have left.**
- Return all borrowed equipment **clean** to the main building.
- **No dogs** allowed in camping or activity areas.
- No drone usage on site without prior approval.
- No generators are to be used on site.

Fires and cooking

- Fires are permitted **only in designated altar fire bays.**
- **No open fires on grass** or turf removal. Repair to ground as a result of this will be charged at £100.
- Limited wood may be available, but we recommend bringing your own. You are welcome to take fallen wood – but no trees are to be felled.
- **No wood piles** - please keep the site tidy.
- If chopping wood, use a **designated area with a groundsheet.**

Behaviour and noise

- Quiet hours: **23:00 – 07:00.** Please respect our neighbours.
- Leaders are responsible for group behaviour and adherence to site rules.

Electricity Hook-Up

- The electric hook ups are caravan-style plugs and are intended for low power devices like lights and phone chargers. **You will need to bring your own cable, perhaps 25m with sockets.**

Activities

- **Field 1 is reserved for activities** such as archery, climbing, and orienteering. Contact us for more information or contact the County MAPS team for advice on permitted activity leaders.

Water and waste

- Each field has at least one **water point** with a hose.
- **Turn taps off** after use to preserve water as we are on a metered supply.
- **Do not wash dishes** or dispose of food waste at the taps. The drains below the taps are only for spills of water and could block and flood the fields.
- **No wet/dry pits** allowed.
- Liquid food waste and grey water **must only** be put in the Elsan points as directed on the signs.
- Use the skip/bins at the main entrance for general waste. **If full, please report and take your rubbish home.** Currently there is limited facility for recycling so please be kind to the earth and take your paper and plastic home for recycling.
- **Do not leave** broken tents, chairs, or bulky waste - **£100 disposal fee applies.**
- In an emergency there is another toilet and shower attached to the main building, the key is stored in a key safe by the gate. **The code for this safe will be provided on request by the site managers.**

Site rules summary

- Always follow Scout values. Please adopt a 'leave no trace' camping style.
- Manage the **single-track access** road responsibly.
- **No vehicle access** on the fields without prior agreement.
- **Keep noise to a minimum between 23:00 – 07:00.**
- No generators are to be used on site.
- Use only **designated fire bays** for open fire cooking.
- **Conserve water** and ensure taps are turned off.
- **Toilets** must be kept clean - groups should share cleaning duties.
- Allow fires to **cool before departure.** Dispose of **cold ash** in bins and stack unused logs neatly.
- Leave all areas **clean and tidy.**
- Only dispose of **camping - related waste** in site bins.
- No drone usage on site without prior approval.
- Report any **damage or concerns** to the Campsite Manager Team.
